# Tense (2): Simple Past Tense; Past Continuous Tense


#### 1. English Verb Tenses

English Verb Tenses	PAST	PRESENT	FUTURE
SIMPLE	I <b>did</b> my homework.	I <b>do</b> my homework.	I will do my homework.
CONTINUOUS	I <b>was doing</b> my	I <b>am doing</b> my	I <b>will be doing</b> my
CONTINUOUS	homework.	homework.	homework.
DEDEECT	I <b>had done</b> my	I <b>have done</b> my	I will have done my
PERFECT	homework.	homework.	homework.
PERFECT	I <b>had been doing</b> my	I <b>have been doing</b> my	I will have been doing
CONTINUOUS	homework.	homework.	my homework.

#### 2. Simple Past Tense: Uses

## (1) Things that had happened at a specific time in the past

□ you know when and you know which event







- **•** E.g. I enjoyed the movie last night.
- **D** E.g. We ate ice-cream yesterday.
- **□** E.g. The children went to school last week.
- **□** E.g. My family visited the UK last month.
- **□** E.g. Eric was a student two years ago.
- **Use with:** 
  - yesterday, last night, last Monday, last week, last month, two years ago, etc.

#### 3. Simple Past Tense: Sentence Structures

#### (1) Positive Form (+ve)

Subject	+ Main Verb
I / You / We / They	Past form
He / She / It	(regular & irregular)

#### **D** Regular verbs

- E.g. play, watch, listen, talk, live, etc.  $\rightarrow$  (ed) played, watched, listened, talked, lived, etc.
- E.g. We watched TV yesterday.

#### □ Irregular verbs

- E.g. do, have, go, get, break, buy, bring, give, eat, drink, etc.
  - → did, had, went, got, broke, bought, brought, gave, ate, drank, etc.
- E.g. Peter, Paul and Mary went to cinema last Monday.

#### (2) Negative Form (-ve)

Subject	+ did not / didn't	+ Main Verb
I / You / We / They	1:1	Dece form
He / She / It	did not / didn't	Base form





- E.g. The kids didn't play games last week.
- **□** E.g. Cecilia didn't bring her cell phone yesterday.

## (3) Questions Form (?)

Did	+ Subject	+ Main Verb	?
Did	I / You / We / They	Base	9
	He / She / It	form	?


□ E.g. Did you see Mr Wong yesterday?

Yes, I did. / No, I didn't.

#### (2) Past Continuous Tense: Uses

#### (1) Past action in progress

**a** unfinished past action at that moment




- **□** E.g. I was heading to the airport at 09:00 yesterday morning.
- **□** E.g. We were watching TV at 10:30 yesterday.
- **Use with:**

yesterday morning, 10:00 last Monday, etc.




(2) Two actions happening at the same time in the past



E.g. I saw you in the library yesterday. You were watching videos on YouTube and playing with your iPhone.

## (3) PAST action A was interrupted by PAST action B



- **D** E.g. We were walking along the road when we saw the headmaster.
- **D** E.g. When the phone rang, mom was cooking in the kitchen.

# 5. Past Continuous Tense: Sentence Structures

# (1) Positive Form (+ve)

Subject	+ was / were	+ Main Verb	
I / He / She / It	was	· c	
You / We / They	were	-ing form	



- **D** E.g. My mom was cleaning the house this morning.
- **D** E.g. The kids were walking home when it rained.

## (2) Negative Form (-ve)

Subject	+ was / were	+ not	+ Main Verb
I / He / She / It	was		in francis
You / We / They	were	not	-ing form

- **D** E.g. I wasn't going home at that time.
- **D** E.g. We weren't swimming yesterday morning.

## (3) Questions Form (?)

Was / Were	+ Subject	+ Main Verb	
Was	I / He / She / It	ing Grand	
Were	You / We / They	-ing form	

**D** E.g. Was Ted having breakfast yesterday morning?

**□** E.g. Were they working at 10 o'clock yesterday?
